Hello and welcome back to the first term in a new class! Lets see what the children will be learning about...

Literacy

To start off the year, we will be looking at a text called 'How to wash a woolly mammoth'. We will be using this to create a set of instructions about how to look after other stone age animals.

Topic

Our Topic for this term is The Stone Age. We will get to learn lots of fun and exciting things about how people lived during this time. This will include an educational trip where the children will get to be Stone Age people for the day! We will learn all about Stone Age houses, hunting, farming, tools and weapons.

PE:

Swimming is taking place this year and will be starting on Friday 17 th September. As well as being one of the most exciting parts of the children's year, it is part of the national curriculum and therefore compulsory. Every Friday, the children need to bring a swimming costume and towel into school, this should be in a bag and is the children's responsibility. 
